

Event brings low-cost, high-quality performances to public

A series of musical performances and art installations included as part of TransmitLIVE will give local music fans an up-close look at some of the country's cutting-edge artists this week.

The appeal of TransmitLIVE, the showcase portion of the annual Transmission Global Summit, a digital media summit currently in progress at the Inn at Laurel Point, is the number of low-cost, high-quality performances open to the public.

"That's the great thing about TransmitLIVE," said local DJ Chris Longshanks, who assisted the event's organizers in curating the activities taking place at the Douglas Street restaurant the Mint.
